was an ambitious and pioneering development. The interface was characterized by an emphasis on simplicity. The complete contact library was placed on the toolbar, with no need to open a separate window. Also, its data was imported directly from MapInfo. The program provided for a convenient, fast automatic splitting of large databases into smaller ones and a convenient database export to common data formats, including MapInfo. In addition to the data import and export, the program included a number of powerful tools such as the creation of custom reports and maps, and the ability to create and export custom views of the database as GIS (geographical information system) files. The program supported all standard Windows 3.0/NT file formats. The program interface was simple.
